

2010 State 4-H Round-up Quilt Challenge Exhibition

1. Individuals, teams, groups, or clubs may enter the 2010 State 4-H Clothing & Textiles Advisory Board Quilt challenge exhibition.
2. 4-Her's may ask for the help of adults in quilt design and construction, but a majority of the work needs to be completed by the 4-H members.
3. The quilt may have any design or theme but must incorporate the use of some of the challenge fabric supplied by the 4-H Clothing & Textiles Advisory Board in combination with your own choice of fabrics.
4. A majority of the challenge fabric should be used in the quilt design. The front or back of challenge fabric may be used. Challenge fabric cannot be altered (dyed, painted, bleached, etc.) Challenge fabric must be used on the quilt top (front).
5. Up to 5 fabrics may be added. Embellishments are welcome.
6. The quilt must have some sort of 4-H identification incorporated into the quilt top.
7. The quilt must be usable and machine washable.
8. Quilt must be a minimum of 45" x 45" (baby quilt) with a maximum size of 60" x 60".
9. Quilts may be hand-quilted, machine-quilted, or hand tied. Hand-tied quilts must have square knots so they will not come un-tied during laundry process. Ties must be cut to $\frac{3}{4}$ " tassels.

10. **A permanent label should be on the back in the lower right corner. Label should include name (s) of quilters, county, and date.**
11. **A hanging sleeve needs to be added to the top of the quilt for display. Instructions for sleeve attachment are at the end of the rules.**
12. **Unfinished quilts will not be exhibited.**
13. **Recognition certificates will be given to all participants.**
14. Quilts will be donated to a charitable organization of your choice or they will be donated to a charitable organization in College Station.
15. Contact information will be attached to the quilt with at safety pin on an index card. This information should include who will be picking up the quilt and their cell phone number, so we can locate them if needed.

If you do not use the challenge fabric, please return to one of the advisors for the Challenge. We want to make sure everyone has a chance to participate.

Instructions for Adding a Sleeve to the Top of your Quilt

1. Cut a 10"-wide strip of washed muslin or cotton fabric, making it 1" shorter than top edge of quilt.
2. Turn under and press 1/2" at each short end, then turn and press again (Diagram I). Stitch in place.
3. With wrong sides together, stitch long edges together 1/4" from raw edges (Diagram II). Press seam open and center it in the tube you've created (Diagram III).
4. Slipstitch the top edge of the tube to the quilt backing about 1" below the inner edge of the binding (Diagram IV).
5. Pin lower edge of sleeve to backing, placing pins 1/4" from lower edge. Turn the folded sleeve edge up and slipstitch sleeve to quilt backing, catching only the lower layer of sleeve (Diagram IV). This allows for a little slack so the sleeve takes the weight of hanging, not the quilt. Make sure that the stitches go through only the backing fabric—they should not be visible on the quilt surface.

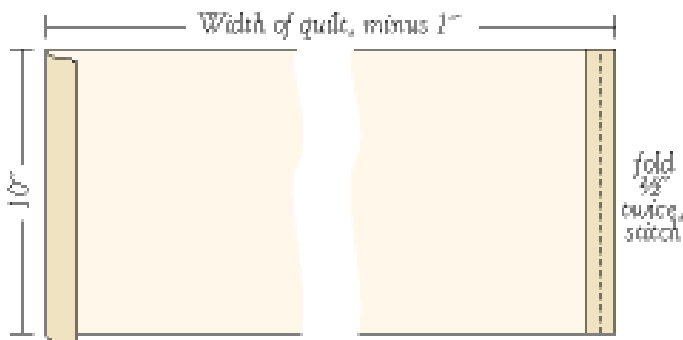


Diagram I

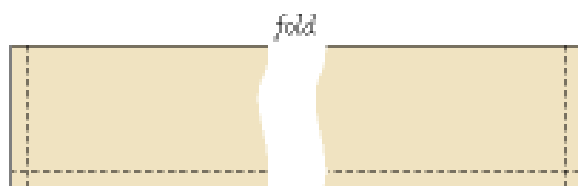

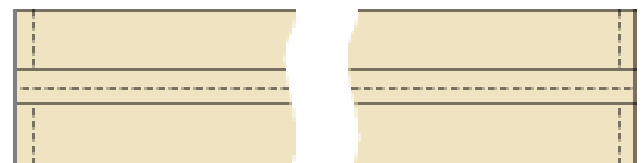

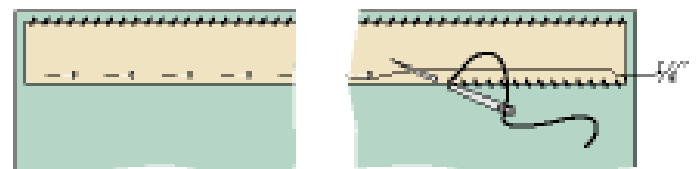
